INTRODUCTION

In this penultimate session, we are going to wade through some principles that apply to and work for Leaders in all cultures, ages and everywhere. A principle or precept is like a LAW which does not care about colour, class, or context, it will deliver for whoever uses it.

Facts may change, but principles do not change. A principle helps to decipher life and situations and removes the fogginess or blurred edges wherever we find ourselves. Whenever anyone clings to or locks themselves unto WISDOM, they will find that they operate wise values and principles that will make them a better version of themselves. Wisdom brings out the original YOU as God created you to be.

#1 Transformation and Change are a product of true Leadership.

Anywhere real leadership lands, there will be a shift in attitude or alteration of the status quo. Moses, Gideon, David are just a few biblical examples of Men who moved the walls of limitation that confronted them and their community.

The Pauline Standard of Leadership

1 Timothy Chapter 3

3 This is a faithful *and* trustworthy saying: if any man [eagerly] seeks the office of woverseer (bishop, superintendent), he desires an excellent task. ² Now an overseer must be blameless *and* beyond reproach, the husband of one wife, self-controlled, sensible, respectable, hospitable, able to teach,

³ not addicted to wine, not □a bully *nor* quick-tempered *and* hot-headed, but gentle *and* considerate, free from the love of money [not greedy for wealth and its inherent power—financially ethical]. ⁴ He must manage his own household well, keeping his children under control with all dignity [keeping them respectful and well-behaved]

⁵ (for if a man does not know how to manage his own household, how will he take care of the church of God?). ⁶ and *He must* not be a new convert, so that he will not [behave stupidly and] become conceited [by appointment to this high office] and fall into the [same] condemnation incurred by the devil [for his arrogance and pride].



⁷ And he must have a good reputation *and* be well thought of by those outside *the church*, so that he will not be discredited and fall into the devil's trap. ⁸ Deacons likewise *must* be men worthy of respect [honourable, financially ethical, of good character], not doubletongued [speakers of half-truths], not addicted to wine, not greedy for dishonest gain,

⁹ but upholding *and* fully understanding the mystery [that is, the true doctrine] of the [Christian] faith with a clear conscience [resulting from behaviour consistent with spiritual maturity]. ¹⁰ These men must first be tested; then if they are found to be blameless *and* beyond reproach [in their Christian lives], let them serve as deacons.

¹¹ Women must likewise be worthy of respect, not malicious gossips, but self-controlled, [thoroughly] trustworthy in all things. ¹² Deacons must be husbands of *only* one wife, and good managers of *their* children and their own households. ¹³ For those who have served well as deacons gain a high standing [having a good reputation among the congregation], and great confidence in the faith which is [founded on and centred] in Christ Jesus.
